Pathways to Health

The Community Development Center established the Pathways to Health (PTH) Program in January 2014 through a grant received from Baptist Healing Trust. The Pathways to Health program provides education, outreach and enrollment assistance into the Affordable Care Act throughout five counties in South Central Tennessee: Bedford, Coffee, Marshall, Maury, and Lawrence. The Community Development Center has been certified by CMS as a Certified Application Counselor Designated Organization and the staff are all Certified though CMS and the State of TN Division of Commerce and Insurance.

The ultimate goals of this program are to create a healthier community in South Central Tennessee and to create a path for individuals and families to gain health insurance through the new health care marketplace and other channels.
