A Story of Great Generosity and Friendship

Mandy Jean, 20, lives in Bedford County with her mom Carol, who serves on our Family Support Local Council. Carol is a single mom and a Detective for the Shelbyville Police Department. Not long ago Carol found it was becoming increasingly difficult to lift Mandy, who has cerebral palsy, into the front seat of their minivan. Carol's hands didn't have the strength they once did, and then this past August, she was diagnosed with rheumatoid arthritis. With this turn of events, it became evident that Carol needed a van with a wheel-



chair ramp. She talked with the Family Support Coordinator about the possibility of using Mandy's funds to help with the purchase, "but they are so expensive," Carol expressed.

It wasn't long before a group of Carol's friends told her they wanted to help. She said no, but they had already begun a fundraising effort called the "Friends of Mandy Jean". In just a few short months, enough money was raised to buy Mandy this like-new 2001 Dodge Caravan with a wheelchair ramp. Now she rides just behind the front seat with her wheelchair securely tied down. Going places has become a lot easier! The story doesn't end here, Carol and Mandy paid this act of kindness and generosity forward by giving their old van to another family in need.

Family Support Sign-Up Information for Fiscal Year 2014-2015

Meeting with you, face-to-face, at least one-time per year, is a required piece of the Family Support Program.

Our sign-up times are the perfect opportunity!

As most of you have learned, the Family Support Program operates on a fiscal year basis, from July 1 to June 30 of the following year. Each year <u>active families MUST SIGN UP</u> to request services for the new year. Family Support is not an entitlement program, therefore, being an active Family Support client does not assure you receive services every year.

Meeting face-to-face, gives us the opportunity to talk about your needs for the new year. Even when the need doesn't change, such as respite/sitter care, it gives us a chance to verify personal information, to sign necessary paperwork, to share resources, and to catch up!

It is very important that you make every effort to sign up in person. Not doing so, could detain your consideration for allocated funds, (and if at all possible, please bring the family member who is actually receiving services). In hopes of making this more convenient we are hosting sign-up events in four counties and you may sign up at any site. (Please let Christy know if you will be signing up in a county *other* than the one in which you live.) The dates, times and places are listed on the back of this newsletter. Our Local Council members will be helping at each site in hopes of keeping your waiting time to a minimum.

To prepare for your time with the Coordinator these are the items you need to bring in order to complete the sign-up process:

- 1. Picture of the client new clients only
- 2. Proof of residence (copy of <u>current</u> utility or telephone bill, letter from social security, etc.)
- 3. Proof of disability <u>must state the disability</u> (<u>current</u> medical note from a physician, therapist or school, or a copy of your child's IEP)
- 4. Proof of Citizenship-new clients only (copy of birth certificate or SSI award letter)
- 5. If you use a sitter, homemaker, or personal assistant we need current information including, names, addresses, and a copy of their social security card or Federal ID number.



Signing Up and the Waiting List...

For Those of You on the Waiting List it is not necessary for you to sign up each year. Your information is kept on file. However, if you'd like to come by during the sign up time in your area, please do. If you have any questions about the waiting list in your county give Christy a call at 931-684-7673.
