The young lady, Hannah Peels, is a former client of the CDC Early Intervention and Family Support programs. The van had been a gift to her parents. The Coordinator immediately thought of this precious young lady, Keely Duck. Her family's only vehicle was a pick-up truck, so when they made their numerous trips to Vanderbilt, Keely had to come out of her chair for the ride, and a stroller was put in the back of the truck to use for her appointments - her wheelchair was just too heavy for mom to lift. The Duck family says they will forever be grateful to Hannah and her family for showing such generosity and compassion at a time when their hearts were broken.





Employment Services

The Employment Services Team is busier than ever! The start of the 2023-2024 school year has increased **Pre-Employment Transition Services** across the CDC's area. The ES team has been hard at work to continue to grow Pre-ETS, aiming to add more schools in Bedford, Hickman, and Coffee counties, as well as add in services in Giles and possibly Lawrence counties. Additionally, the Community Development Center is now a provider of the new MAPs (Medicaid Alternative Pathways to Independence) program for the DIDD! In MAPs, the ES team will work with transition-age youth to help them meet goals of independence at home, in the community, and at work, specifically with the use of Enabling Technology.

SUCCESSSTORY

The Employment Services team began working with Kyle in June 2023 for our Pre-Employment Transition Services summer program. We met with Kyle weekly at our office in Pulaski. Kyle has limited verbal communication, but uses some signs to communicate with others. Kyle's mom expressed interest in helping Kyle identify his career interests. With verbal communication being a potential barrier, we wanted to make sure to customize our instruction and utilize technology to allow Kyle to express his interests and explore what careers he may be interested in. Through picture interest inventories and virtual job exploration activities, Kyle displayed a strong interest in stocking and cleaning. Kyle was able to use technology to show me and his mom what work tasks he thought he would enjoy and possible locations for work, such as grocery stores and schools.

Once we identified that Kyle had a strong interest in stocking and cleaning, we were able to have him practice work-related skills found in those career areas. Using picture task lists and prompts, Kyle practiced stocking and organizing grocery items, washing dishes, washing clothes, and other cleaning tasks. Kyle used his AAC device and body language to express excitement in each task, and he excelled in every area!

That I am a survivor, and was able to start a new life in Tennessee free from what was holding me back.


5. Do you have a hidden talent? What is it?
